Has the music curriculum been adjusted to make it more accessible for pupils with specific needs, e.g. SEND?	<p>Our vision is to make music accessible for all children including those with SEND. Pupils with SEND are exposed to the same resources, equipment and vocabulary as every other pupil. They are given the same opportunities to explore instruments, listen to and perform musical pieces.</p> <p>We provide singing assemblies for the whole school. Musical instruments are available for access during music lessons. Children who are not able to access assembly, have the chance to sing in their classrooms during this time.</p>	Musical instruments and resources for music lessons.	<p>The music lead will make sure all children are able to access music lessons and musical activities such as singing assemblies</p> <p>This will be achieved by encouraging children who do not attend assemblies, to listen to music in calmer conditions such as another classroom.</p> <p>During lessons, children have access to ear defenders as well as a variety of quieter instruments.</p>	September 2024 (reviewed at least half termly)
