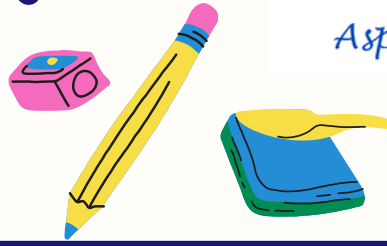

This week in Year 4...

This week has been another busy and exciting one in Year 4. The children have completed their final assessments of the year, and we are incredibly proud of the determination, resilience and positive attitudes they have shown. They have worked hard throughout the year and should be very proud of all they have achieved. Alongside their assessments, the children have continued preparing for their Roald Dahl-themed oracy performances. They have been developing their confidence as speakers, rehearsing their performances and thinking carefully about expression, pace and audience engagement. We also enjoyed our annual Summer Fayre, which was a wonderful opportunity for the children to celebrate the end of a successful year with friends, family and staff. The children thoroughly enjoyed taking part in the activities and soaking up the fantastic atmosphere.

In English, the children explored how authors use verbs to add detail and interest to their writing. They wrote letters to characters using conditional language, inferred characters' thoughts and feelings from evidence in texts, explored characters through role-play activities, and practised summarising the main events of a story. In Maths, we focused on geometry. The children developed their understanding of angles as turns, identified acute and obtuse angles, compared and ordered angles, and explored the properties of different triangles and quadrilaterals.

In Science, the children revised their learning from our Electricity and Circuits unit. They also practised gathering and recording data accurately, applying the scientific skills they have developed throughout the year. In Art and Design, the children explored textile techniques and used them to create and develop patterns, showing creativity and attention to detail. In PSHE, the children learned about different ways of keeping money safe and discussed how to make sensible financial choices. In Geography, the children identified and located some of the world's longest rivers, developing their knowledge of global geography. Finally, in Music, the children composed and notated their own motifs, demonstrating their growing understanding of musical composition.

It has been a fantastic week of learning and celebration, and we are incredibly proud of all the children for their hard work and achievements.
