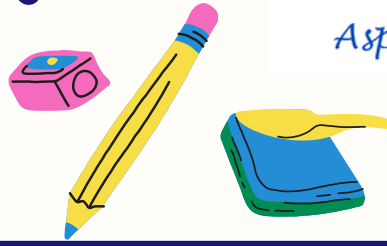

This week in Year 4...

proudly performed their Roald Dahl oracy projects, demonstrating fantastic confidence, expression and presentation skills. We have been incredibly impressed with the effort they have put into preparing their performances. Despite the recent heatwave, the children have continued to work with resilience, determination and a positive attitude. They have also enjoyed the exciting opportunity to meet their new teachers and find out their Year 5 classes. It was wonderful to see so much enthusiasm as they begin to look forward to the next stage of their school journey.

In English, we began exploring our new text, Varmints. The children used expanded noun phrases to describe scenes, experimented with personification to bring settings to life, retold part of the film narrative in the first person, identified and justified their opinions about the story, and finished the week by writing poems using a range of figurative language devices.

In Maths, the children interpreted charts and line graphs, compared data by finding sums and differences, learned how to draw their own line graphs, and completed their end-of-block assessment.

In Science, we revised our learning on States of Matter, consolidating the knowledge and vocabulary the children have developed throughout the unit. In Art and Design, the children learned how to create repeating patterns, experimenting with shape, colour and repetition to produce eye-catching designs. In PSHE, the children reflected on the year and began setting future goals, thinking about the aspirations and achievements they would like to work towards. In Computing, the children explored why seeing lots of people sharing the same opinions or beliefs online does not necessarily make them true, helping to develop their critical thinking and digital literacy skills. Finally, in Music, the children combined and performed different versions of a musical motif, demonstrating excellent listening, rhythm and teamwork.

It has been another wonderful week of learning, and we are incredibly proud of the enthusiasm, resilience and maturity the children have shown as they prepare for their exciting transition into Year 5.
